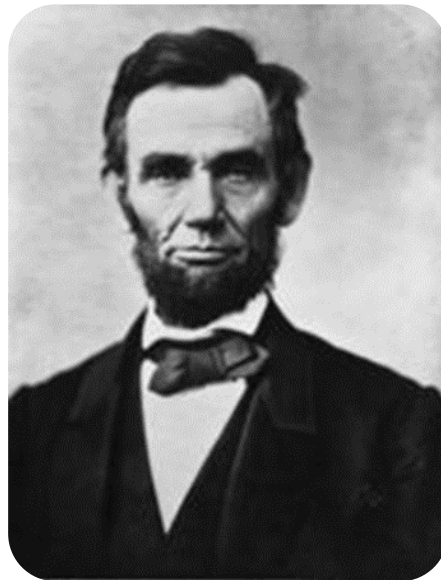

- * Offering someone substandard service options based on their looks
- * Racial profiling

3. Don't every touch a black woman's hair or anything else on her person without permission.
4. Don't every say "All Lives Matter – not just black people."
5. Don't ever say "I'm not a racist."
